Dear Parent/Carer,

School Uniform

As we approach the end of the academic year, I am writing to all parents to ask for your support to ensure that all our young people return in August in the school uniform as is described in our school prospectus. I appreciate that fashions evolve and for that reason we have made a few changes to the school uniform.

As previously shared, the uniform is to consist of:-

- Black trousers. "Jeans cut" trousers are acceptable (not ripped, leggings, tracksuit or denim).
- Black skirt (mid-thigh to knee length)
- Black shorts/culottes (mid-thigh to knee length)
- Plain white shirt and tie
- Badged jumper or cardigan. This is not compulsory but recommended.
- Black shoes/boots/trainers (no coloured soles or logos)

Our school uniform is there to show our identity in school, within the local community and further afield when on the many trips that are on offer during the academic session. It allows all pupils to be on equal standing and, therefore, takes away the competition to have the most expensive fashion items.

Sweatshirts and other types of jumpers are not allowed to be worn in the school building. Jackets and coats worn to school will be required to be removed when entering school; lockers are available to all pupils to store them if required.

I fully appreciate that this may cause some parents/carers issues with their child. It is important that home is aware of our expectations and we will continue to work on these at school. If pupils do not follow this request, they will be spoken to and home will be contacted.

Thank you to the families and pupils that have supported the school and ensured that the correct uniform is worn; it is very much appreciated.
